## P&C WISH LIST

### EARLY STAGE ONE & STAGE ONE

Dear committee members of the Figtree Public School P&C.

Thank you for giving us the opportunity to speak with you about the needs of Early Stage One and Stage One.

Early Stage One and Stage One consists of 5 classes.

- 2 Kindergarten classes taught by Miss Demertzi & Miss Monteleone.
- 1 Year One class taught by Mrs O'Connor.
- 2 Year One and Year Two classes taught by Mrs Calderaro & Mrs Peros.

All the teachers are involved in L3 training this year. Miss Demertzi is at the maintenance level of her training while the other 4 teachers are at the starting point.

We will require additional resources to implement this amazing program that supports students in their reading and writing.

We have consulted with Miss Harding (L3 trainer in 2015) as to the monetary amount we will need and together we have estimated that \$8 000.00 will get all the classes started in implementing the L3 program.

We also need a book rack and the coat hanger bags that go with it so we can organise the reading books and a set of magnetic Vowel and Consonant letters for one of the Kindergarten classes.

Three of the five classes only have four ipads each. We need 6 more ipads to make it 6 per class so we can run a small group in maths and literacy.

## STAGE 2 FUNDING REQUESTS BY STAGE 2

**LITERACY PRO:** Annual licenses for all Stage 2 students, totally **\$818.18**, to ensure continued access to Literacy Pro, our Stage 2 Home Reading with class support program.

**WHITEBOARDS: (INDIVIDUAL)**

To facilitate many of the Focus On Reading strategies, as well as Mathematical strategies, Stage 2 would like a small whiteboard for each individual student. Total Cost: **\$298.04**. Students are currently providing their own whiteboard markers.

**CONNECTORS (reading texts)- SERIES 1 – NON-FICTION**

To facilitate student access to several of the Focus On Reading teaching/learning strategies, it would be extremely advantageous to access additional non-fiction reading texts, particularly multiple copies (sets of 6) to enable small group focused instruction and learning. Connectors are a recommended series by the Department facilitators of Focus On Reading. Total Cost: **\$1769.00**

**LAPTOPS:**


New syllabus requirements have vastly increased the amount of access to technology required by each student across a variety of platforms. This may include written, spoken, non-verbal, visual or multimodal communications of meaning including sound, print, film, electronic and multimedia representations and coding. They may be extended unified works, a series of related pieces or a single, simple piece of communication.

- In Stage 2, our equipment is frequently used to access Studyladder, Literacy Pro and Sunshine-on-line to support our Reading and Mathematics programs.
- In addition, our students view and compose texts using animation and slow-mation, create digital reports and explanations using iMovie and iPhoto and access ebooks and other digital media, on-line databases and so on.
- At present, laptop ratio is 1:15 students, shared across Stages 2 and 3, although some of our Apple Macbooks are now 6 years + in age). Logistical problems continue regarding the actual sharing of the equipment, in terms of the safe movement of laptops, the time taken to move equipment from building to building (Stage 2 is now in 2 separate buildings) and the class timetabling difficulties that arise when equipment must be shared throughout the core teaching times.
- **REQUEST:** Stage 2 would like 4 Apple Macbooks for each Stage 2 class, to be predominantly kept in each Stage 2 classroom. Individual item price is \$1760 (includes 4 year warranty)

## Stage 3 Wish List 2016

### Reading: Linked to Focus on Reading Program

We would like to purchase some sets of Into Connector reading books by Scholastics to use with our new FoR program. This program concentrates on teaching comprehension skills and has been developed specifically to try and increase the student's skills in all areas of comprehension, including inferring, visualising, making connections, predicting, using prior knowledge, summarising and questioning.

These books are appropriate for group work and come in sets of six. They are particularly good for reciprocal reading where each child in the group has a role to play in the reading activity.

The cost of these books would be \$900 for 12 sets of 6 books.

### Technology: Linked to History, Geography and other areas of the curriculum.

Each stage 3 class currently has 8 I pad's each and would be able to use them more effectively if we had at least had enough to share one between two.

The new History and Geography syllabus require a lot of inquiry learning and research. To teach these skills we need the technology. It is much more conducive to work in the children's own classroom for this type of research task than down in the computer room which can quite often cause problems during a lesson e.g. slow to log on, not all log on all the time etc

Costs:

\$619 per unit (\$18570 for 30) + \$300 for power boards (5plugs)

Total- \$18,600- \$18,800

### Mathematics

Number cases to complement the new Origo Math resource we are using across the school. They include numeral expanders, fraction posters, mix and match cards for fractions, 6 digits and 7 digits, place value sliders and number line cards.

\$160 per case we need three more boxes

Total cost on the Stage 3 wish list: \$20,180

This year in Banksia we have students with increasingly complex needs enrolled in all 3 classes.

Communication is one of the most important skills for any child to develop. Children without verbal language often need assistive technology (Augmentative and Alternative Communication Systems) to enable them to Communicate with their friends and teachers.

AAC has proven to be a powerful tool in providing students an opportunity to participate in daily life.

At the moment we have only 1 touch switch and 1 recordable switch to share between 3 classes and 6 students. This does not allow the children to have adequate daily access to AAC systems to meet their communication needs.

We are requesting: 1 small weighted blanket \$195

-4 Touch switches to operate the computer or switch adapted toys

-Big Red Switch 13cm \$95

-Ringed saucer switch \$116.39

-Super bumpy Switch \$99

-Jelly bean twist switch \$95

COST: \$400

- 3 recordable touch switch to assist with daily interaction suitable for the needs of the students.

-Big Mack Recordable Communicator \$203,

-Little Step by Step \$262,

-Mini Com (single message x3) \$143

COST:\$600

-4 switch toys, to be selected to meet the needs of individual children.

Eg. Musical Dog \$88,

Buzz Light year Bubble machine\$66,

Busy gears (Light and sound) \$110,

Foam Fountain\$200.

COST: \$500

TOTAL COST= \$ 1,300

We realise that this is a substantial investment, but for these children it is their only opportunity to do the things we all take for granted, like talk to our friends, make a request or access the computer.

## Wish List for Banksia IO /IS Unit

Wish 1 –

### \* Renewal of the subscription to the ‘SunshineOnLine’ reading scheme Cost: \$250

- Banksia has had an annual subscription to this excellent reading scheme for the past few years.
- School has purchased a full set of the readers and a set of the home readers. These hard copies are used in conjunction with the electronic scheme.
- Valuable support aids for each reader have been made by staff to enhance the learning of our students. Many support activities are based around the electronic activities associated with the readers.
- The electronic versions provide access to learning activities which is sometimes denied to our students due to their poor dexterity and motor control.
- Students from the mainstream, who are struggling with their reading skills, use our ‘Sunshineonline’ readers, access the support activities and use the online program.
- Banksia needs to renew the annual subscription to access the online program in 2016. The online program is now accessible on both computer and iPad.

## Wish 2-

### Purchase of a suitable sound system, with speakers inside the Banksia 'Bus Stop' area and speakers outside in the Banksia play area.

Cost: \$1,900 (Sturman Electronics quote)

- Banksia students meet twice daily in the re-vamped Banksia kitchen area known as 'Bus Stop'.
- They participate in a variety of social and educational activities to learn communication skills, co-ordination skills, social skills and routines. It is an important part of the day.
- Music, singing and rhythm activities play an important part of the 'Bus Stop' activities. Music encourages language in our students with little communication skills as music and song set the rhythm of the words.
- We currently use CD players which are unsatisfactory for many reasons – reliability, volume, quality of sound, access. Over the past 8 years we have replaced the CD player several times.
- Currently there is no system to allow students access to music in the outside Banksia play area. Our population of students with severe disabilities is increasing. Music is something all our students enjoy, regardless of their physical or intellectual disability.
- We have obtained two quotes – Sturman Electronics \$1,900  
Pro Lighting & Sound \$3,687

Quotes attached.

- The Sturman's Electronic quote is based on a reconditioned stereo receiver .

Wish 3 –

**Air conditioning for Banksia 2 Classroom.**

- Banksia 2 classroom is the only classroom in the school not air conditioned.
- All Banksia students would benefit from air conditioning. Many of our students have health issues which can be triggered by overheating – eg overheating of the body can trigger Epileptic seizures in several Banksia students.

*If funds are limited and cannot extend to air-conditioning Banksia 2 classroom in 2016, we request P&C consider this in future budgets.*



## Garden Wish List

### Submitted by the Environment Committee for upgrade and revitalization of the school gardens and environment.

- 10 tonnes of garden soil
- Ideally \$1,000 for plants to be planted in all three gardens. –
  1. Herb garden – currently in the raised garden beds behind the library
  2. Gnome garden – current garden between the Early Stage 1 block and the Stage 3 buildings.
  3. Boomerang garden – to be located between the herb garden and the end of the Stage 3 building.
- \$100 for gardening equipment ( kids size gloves, shovels, hoes, scissors, watering cans etc)
- Enough mulch to cover tops of the gardens
